
Dear Mr. Gilderbloom and Mr. Lyons:



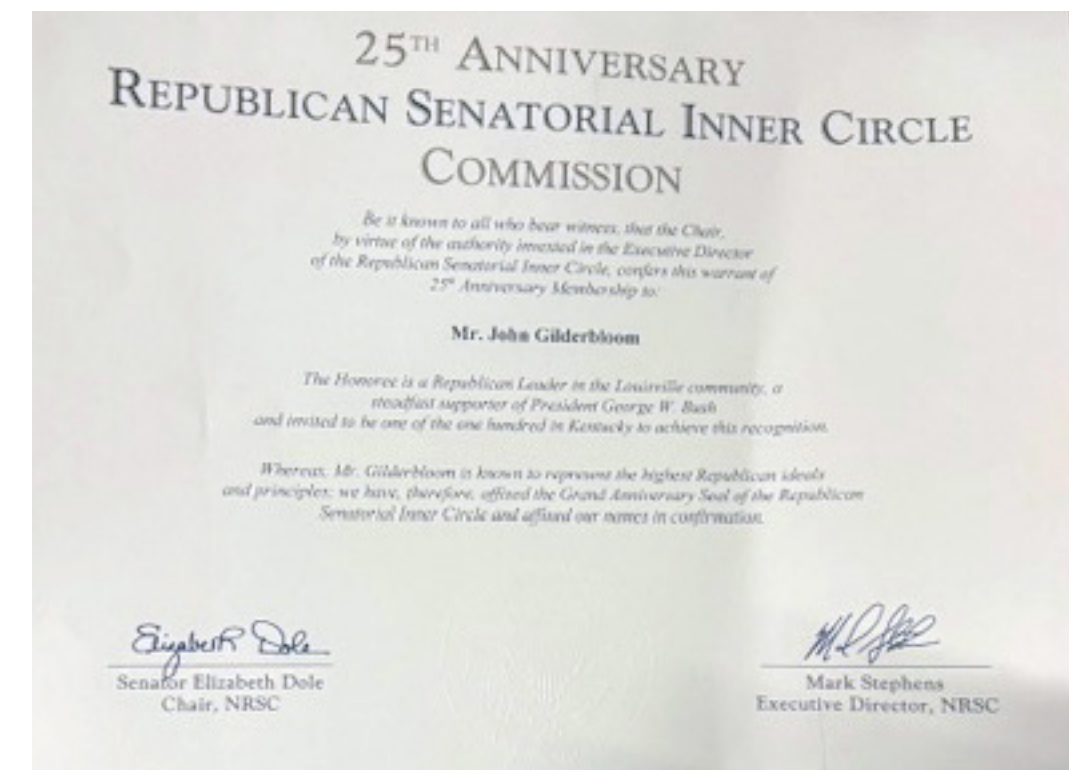
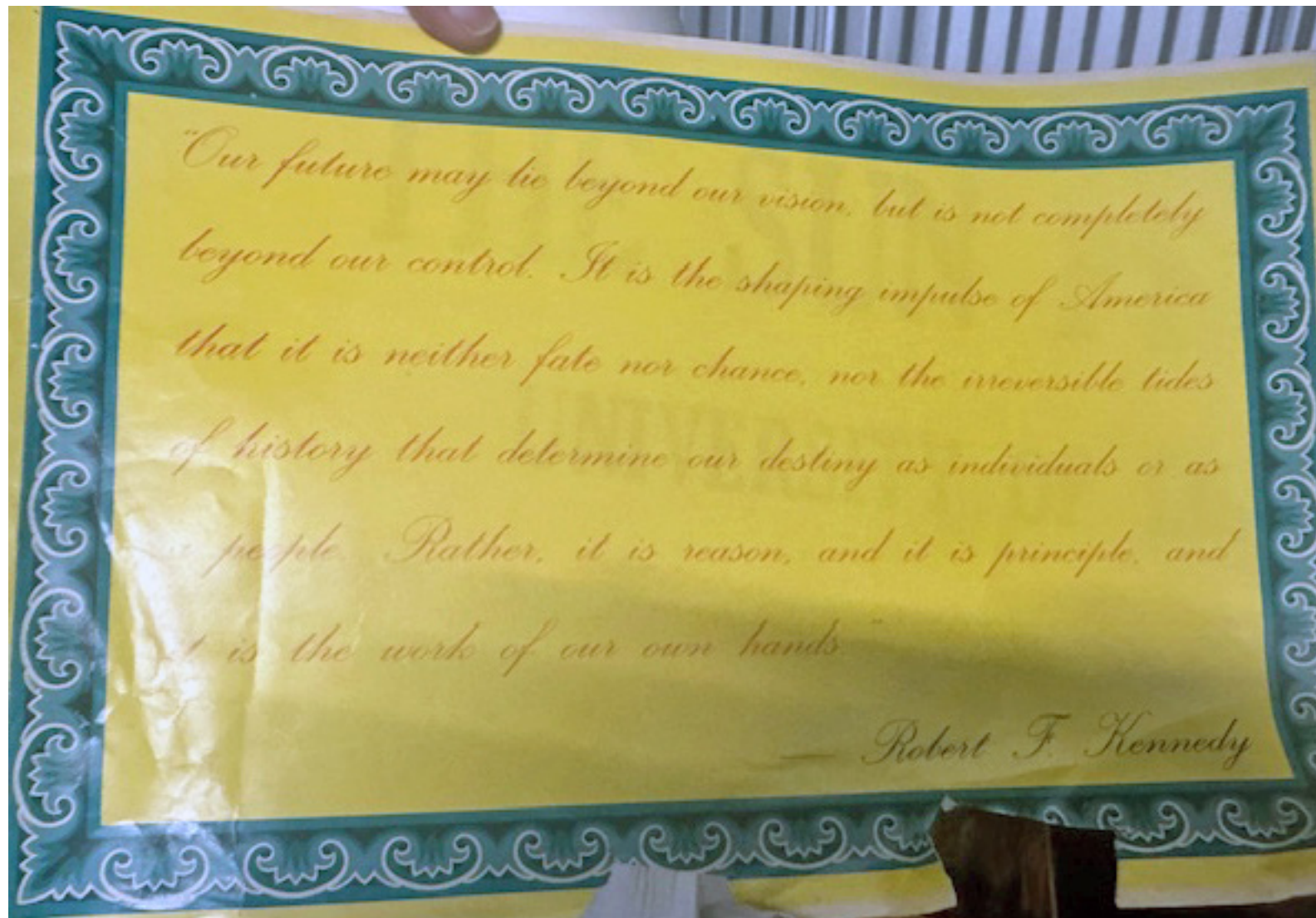
Thank you for your letter of March 17 and the copy of HANDS On!. I hope your participation in the National Housing and Community Development Conference was successful.
